





Information Sharing to Tackle Violence (Information Standards Board for Health and Social Care 2014)

25% of ED's share ISTV data

OUH enhanced Cardiff Model

Implementing the model

Producing high quality data. Expansion of the data set

Enhanced Data Set	National Minimum Data set *
Arrival date/time *	Ethnicity
Gender	Relationship
Age	Assault type/description *
Postcode (first 3 or 4 digits) *	Presenting complaint
Place of injury *	Sharp object used *
Assault method *	Alcohol related violence
Where the patient had his/her last drink	Violence no evidence of alcohol
The weapon used *	School/university/language school



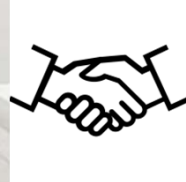
**The Emergency Department Community
Safety Practitioner: Collaborative approach**

- Clinical intervention – drugs, alcohol, homelessness, violence and frequent attenders
- Follow the patient after discharge
- Co-ordinate and lead Case Conferences and Multi Agency Management Plans

The Emergency Department Community Safety Practitioner: Collaborative approach

In summary:

- One key person designated member of the team
- Collaborative partnership - Cardiff Model & community safety focus
- Caldicott principles
- Engagement ED clinical and ED reception staff



Conclusion: Collaborative data sharing has greater result in community safety & reduces ED attendances
